A new post-doctoral research scientist position is available at Faculty of Environmental Earth Science, Hokkaido University, Japan. Basic Job Function: The candidate is expected to conduct synthetic research on the atmospheric processes in the Tropical Tropopause Layer through observational, theoretical, and/or modeling studies.

Qualification: The candidate is required to have Ph.D in related area at least before taking the position.

Job Duty: Five days a week, Monday through Friday with leaves on national holidays. Discretionary work routine: standard working hours starting from 8:30 and finishing at 17:00, but exact working time will be determined for each worker on a case by case basis.
