Inquiries Regarding Student Safety Information

Since the Hokkaido Eastern Iburi Earthquake happened on 6 September 2018, Hokkaido University has been seeking to confirm the safety of all students. Students who have not replied to the urgent e-mail from the university to report their safety status,

and students who have not received such e-mails are requested to immediately contact

their faculties/schools and report their status.

In addition, students or their supporters (the persons responsible for the payment

of students' educational expenses) who have suffered from material damages to their

properties due to the Earthquake are also requested to report their circumstances to

relevant faculties/schools.

■ Start of Second Semester

As Hokkaido University facilities have not been found to have suffered damage

severe enough to cancel classes, we have decided to start the second semester as

scheduled. As for the intensive courses or training programs conducted both on and off-

campus during summer, please contact the relevant faculties/schools.

Life at the University

For students who are having difficulty adjusting after the earthquake (not sleeping,

no appetite, feelings of fear or anxiety), Hokkaido University provides counseling services.

Exemption of tuition fees

For students or their supporters (a person who is responsible for the payment of student's educational expense) who have suffered damage from the Hokkaido Eastern Iburi Earthquake, Hokkaido University will exempt the student's tuition fee based on submission of a Fee Exemption Application. The applicant is required to submit (1) the Affliction Certificate (issued by municipal governments), (2) a document which shows the amount of money needed for restoration, and (3) coverage provided for damage by insurance. The applicant who doesn't have (2) and/or (3) should submit the Affliction Certificate (1) first.

Currently Hokkaido University receives applications for the exemption of tuition fees for the second semester not only for those affected by the Earthquake, but also for other cases, and the submission deadline is 28 September 2018. Applications are considered on a semester-by-semester basis and in cases where applications have been made for both semesters in 2018, results for the first semester will not necessarily carry over to the second. Students who applied for both semesters already and suffered damage from this Earthquake is advised to apply for exemption again to notify the change of his/her economic status.
